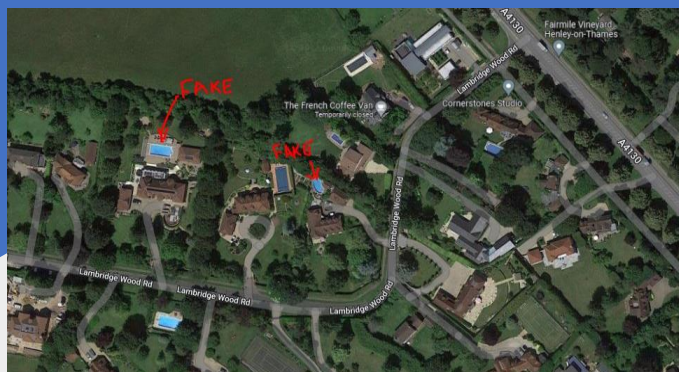


Although I walked today, I did hear that there was Karma on the Hash as Non Stick laughed at someone who fell off a curb and promptly did exactly the same himself!...
